

GrUnCh 21 will be visiting them in May...



Pause with God Read Lamentations 3:17-26

"I cannot find peace or remember happiness. I tell myself, "I am finished! I can't count on the Lord to do anything for me." Just thinking of my troubles and my lonely wandering makes me miserable. That's all I ever think about, and I am depressed". (Lamentations 3:17-20 CEV)

Be aware of Depression: Anyone can suffer from depression, that is why (as a believer in Christ), you and I ought to look after one another in love daily, because we all know that living out our individual lives is never easy.

Take a look at these statistics: The World Health Organization estimates that about 350 million people suffer from depression.

- Untreated depression is the number one cause of suicide
- Suicide is the second leading cause of death in 15–44-year-olds.
- Over 800,000 people die due to suicide every year. Way back in 2014, close to 43,000 thousand people in America died to suicide. In Australia, 3, 214 people died by suicide in 2023

- We lose about as many people to suicide each year as we do to breast cancer.
- Depression is the leading cause of alcoholism, drug abuse, and other addictions. 1 in 5 adults will experience some form of mental illness.

Do you ever go through despair and hopelessness and feel like no one is listening to your fervent prayers? If you have, you are in good company. The Bible is filled with characters who were depressed, discouraged and angry with God. One of those characters was the writer of Lamentations.

The writer of Lamentations was a traumatized person being held captive in Babylon. His friends chastise him for having any faith in God!

The writer of Lamentations suffered from what some call "situational depression."

This week (Tuesday March 25), I presided over the painful funeral service of a young family friend who tragically passed away through suicide due to this so-called situational depression.

Many experience this kind of depression. A lost job can trigger it. Losing a loved one can trigger it. Going through a divorce can trigger it. For some, depression can be a form of suppressed anger. Something happens to you that really "tees" you off, but you never deal with that anger, and so you get depressed. The late psychiatrist, M. Scott Peck, wrote in his book, "The Road Less Travelled" that much mental illness, including chronic depression, occurs as a result of our unwillingness to go through the necessary pain of facing the truth in our lives, the truth that will set us free.

Depression can hit any of us for a variety of reasons. It is a fact of life. If you are suffering from it right now, you are not alone! Also know that it is not a sign of spiritual weakness. And it is never a sign that God is punishing us.

Get Help! - The good news is that depression can be successfully treated. In fact, 80 percent of those treated show an improvement in the first 4 to 6 weeks of treatment. Unfortunately, 2/3rds of those who suffer from depression do not receive treatment. Some depressions just need to take their course. A time of grief, stress, or illness has come, and the brain has released chemicals that serve to numb the mind and body. It is like a shock absorber. Eventually it will wear off.

For some people, depression doesn't wear off. In some people, the brain and its chemicals get so out of balance that clinical depression may occur. If you or someone you know is showing even the slightest signs of chronic or clinical depression, please seek help as soon as possible. Call out for help to friends, church elders and or professional people and someone will refer you to the right counsellor who can help lead you back to wholeness and joy. Do not wait to get help. Keep trusting on God, and keep praying. God is real. He will find a way to heal you.

Prayer-Heavenly Father, please strengthen our hearts, and remind us to encourage one another when the troubles of life start to overwhelm us. Please guard our hearts from depression. Give us the strength up to rise up each day and fight against the struggles which seek to weigh us down. Amen.
