

Pause with God

The scene **in Luke** chapter 24:44-53 takes place in Jerusalem, in the upper room where the disciples had gathered after the resurrection of Jesus. The room is dimly lit by oil lamps, casting a warm glow on the faces of those present. The air is filled with a mix of emotions – disbelief, joy, confusion, and awe.

The disciples are gathered together, including Peter, John, James, and the others who had followed Jesus during his ministry. They are still reeling from the events of the past few days – the crucifixion, the empty tomb, and the sightings of the risen Jesus. They are discussing in hushed tones the reports of Jesus appearing to various individuals and groups.

Suddenly, Jesus himself appears in their midst, standing among them. The disciples are startled and frightened, thinking they are seeing a ghost. Jesus reassures them, showing them his hands and feet, and even eating a piece of broiled fish to prove he is not a spirit. He then opens their minds to understand the Scriptures, explaining how everything that happened was foretold in the Law of Moses, the Prophets, and the Psalms. Finally, he blesses them and ascends into heaven, leaving them in awe and wonder at the miraculous events they have witnessed.


