



Pause with God

More than a Meal

Matthew 26:17-30

The Passover was one of the major feasts for the Jewish people, a time to get together and remember the amazing deliverance of their ancestors from slavery in Egypt. In a startling way it prefigured the deliverance that Jesus would bring through his death on the cross.

Celebration turns to sadness, however, as Jesus reveals that one of his disciples will soon betray him. This causes much heart searching, but Judas vehemently denies it is him, adding to his wrongdoing. Amazingly, he is still welcome to share in the meal. Such is the grace shown towards him.

The climax of the evening comes in a simple moment of ceremony as Jesus breaks bread representing his body which will be broken on the cross and shares the cup representing the blood that will be shed to bring about forgiveness. This is the truth we remember whenever we share communion together - the offering of his life, that we may know forgiveness and be reconciled to God.

Waisea will be on leave from the 20th April. He will conduct his final services of worship at Tea Gardens on the 12th April and at Raymond Terrace on 19th April which will be a combined service of Raymond Terrace, Tillgerry, Medowie and Karuah.
